

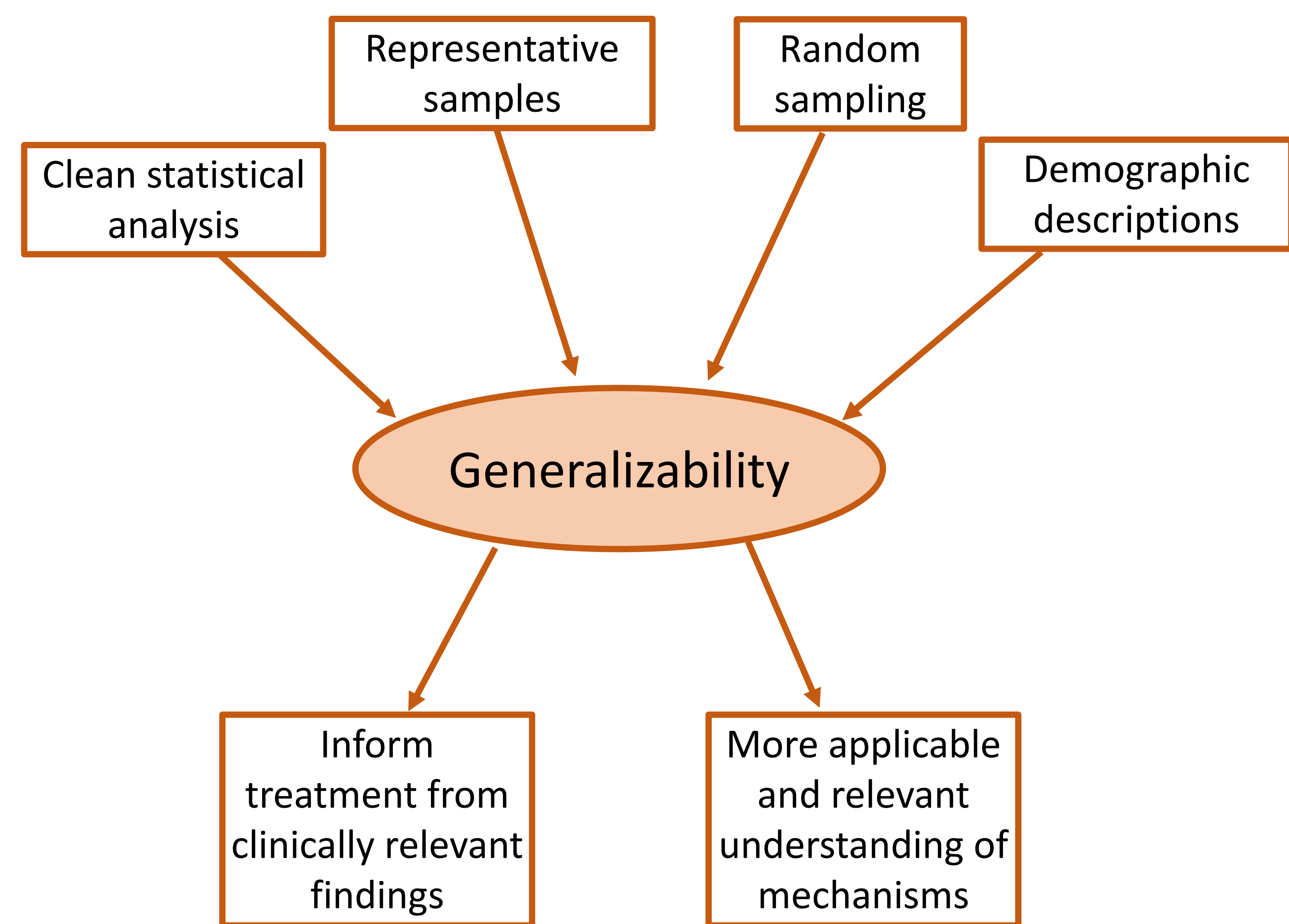

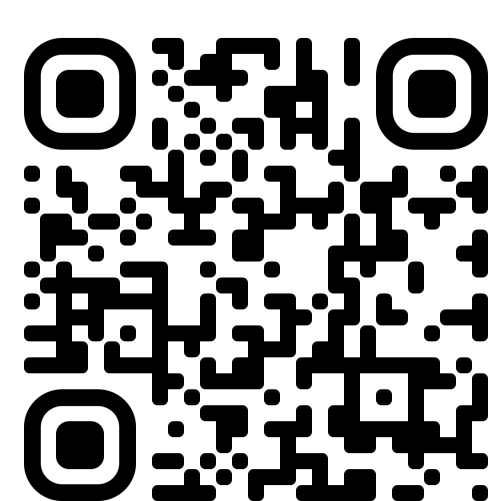

Methods

We coded empirical articles containing studies with **psychophysiological methods** from:

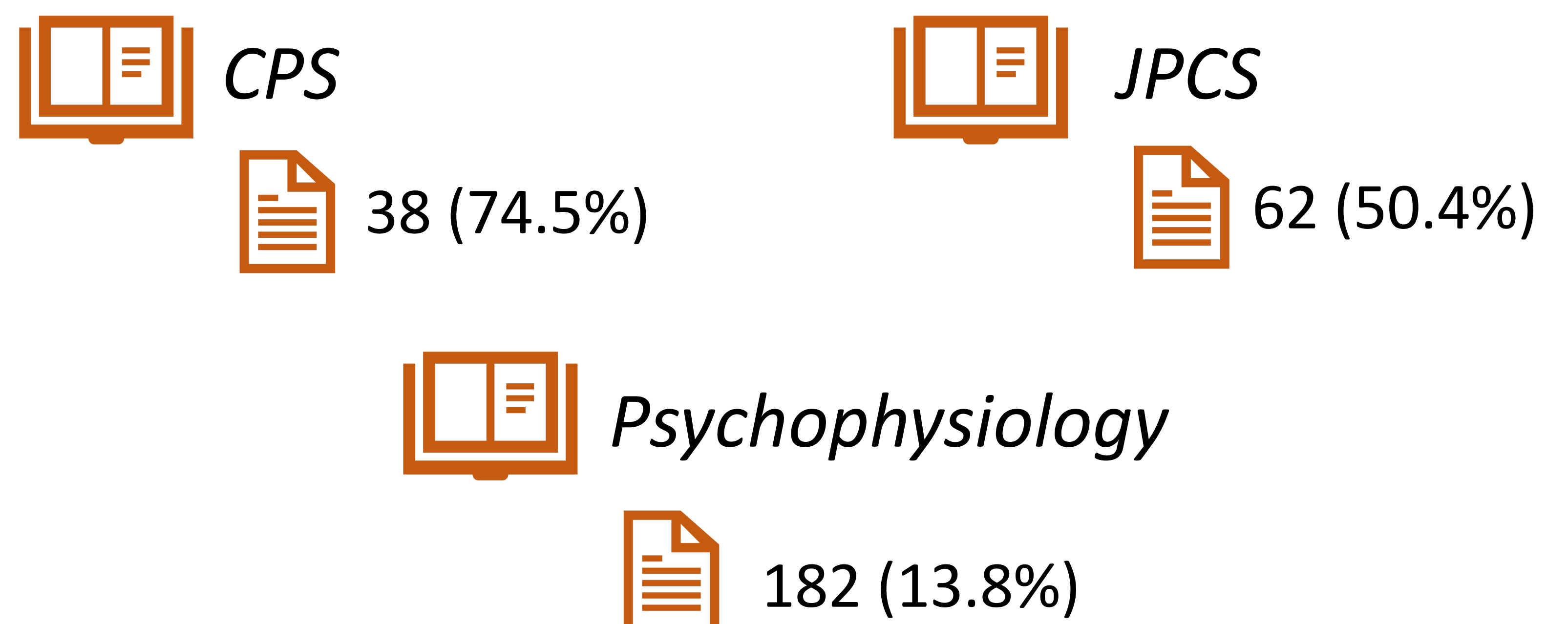
- Psychophysiology** journal article: 1315
- Clinical Psychological Science (CPS)** journal article: 51
- Journal of Psychopathology and Clinical Science (JPCS)** journal article: 123

Across three time periods:

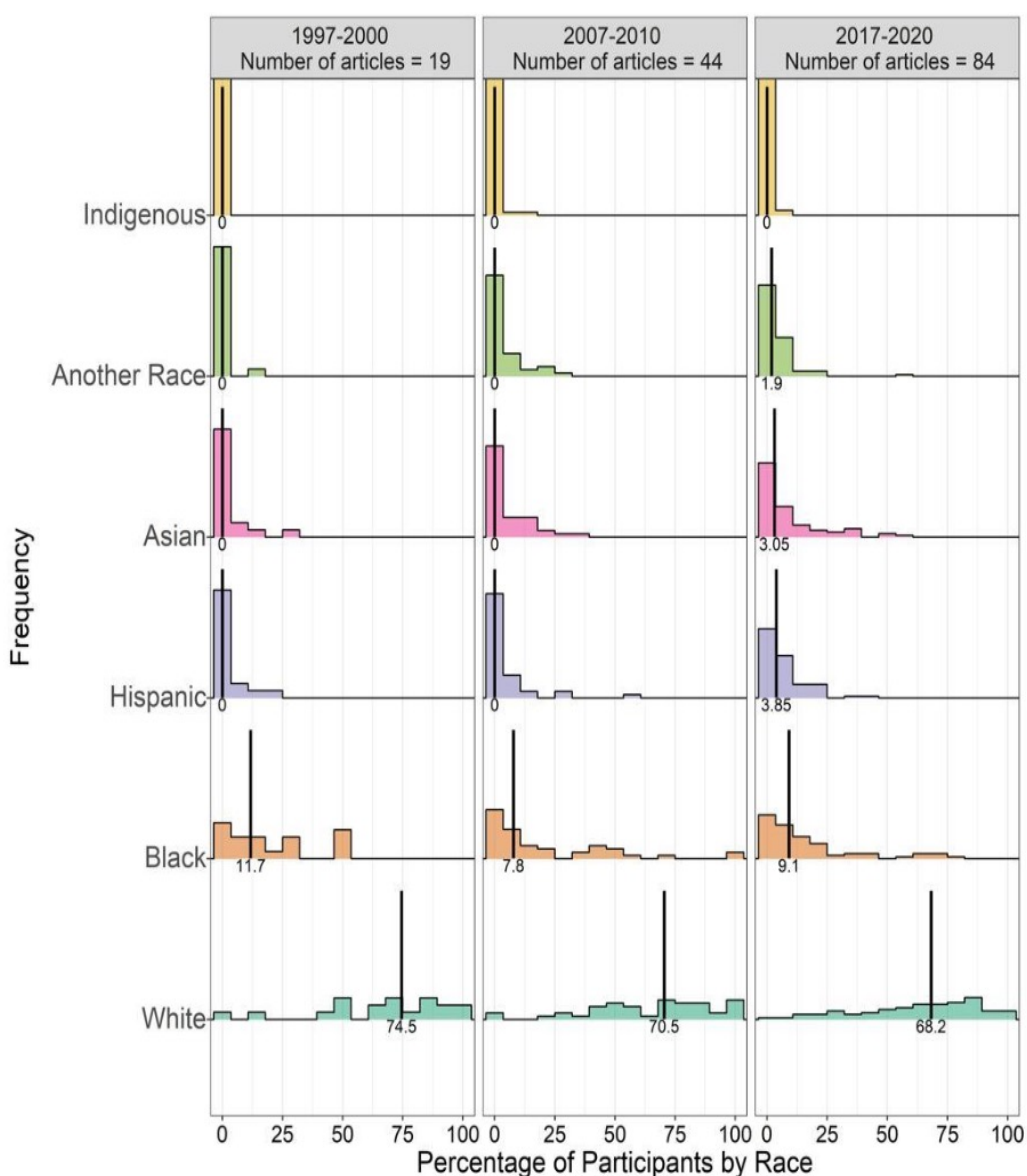
- 1997-2000
- 2007-2010
- 2017-2020

Results

Out of all empirical articles, the following reported race/ethnicity description in main text or supplement:



Of the 13.8% of articles that reported race/ethnicity in *Psychophysiology*, representation was as follows:



* Black line refers to the median due to overdispersion of percentages
